BIBLE PASSAGE: God as the Shepherd ((Psalm 23))

FAITH WORD: PEACE

Psalm 23 uses a metaphor in which God is represented as a shepherd and God's followers as sheep. The psalm proclaims God as the Shepherd, who will provide for God's people always.

Peace is not directly spoken about in Psalm 23, but the passage was designed to bring peace to the reader. Generations of Christians have looked to this passage during difficult times as a reminder of God's love and peaceful presence. Many people memorize Psalm 23 to provide comfort in their lives.

PEACE BOTTLES

Sometimes we need something to help us calm down and feel peaceful, make a Peaceful Bottle. When we are feeling scared or worried, we can use the Peaceful Bottle to help us remember Psalm 23. God loves us and always cares for us.

Supplies: 16-ounce clear plastic bottle; distilled water; ½ cup glitter glue; shiny glitter or confetti; waterproof, heavy-duty glue; teaspoons and measuring cups



- Start the assembly of the bottle by adding ½ cup of distilled water to the bottle. Add ½ cup of glitter glue to the distilled water in the bottle.
- Add about ¼ teaspoon of glitter to the bottle. Total amount of glitter should be about 2 teaspoons.
- Top off the bottle with distilled water, leaving about a half-inch space at the top of the bottle. Secure the lid tightly with the waterproof, heavy-duty glue. Shake.

PEACEFUL PRAYER BRACELET

Supplies: beads (white, green, black, yellow), string or
yarn, scissors

There are so many ways God is with us and gives us
peace. Let's make a bracelet to remember the Bible
story.

- o Thread beads onto a piece of string or yarn in
this order: white, green, black, and yellow.
- o Tie the string or yarn so that it is wide enough to
fit over your hand.
- o Cut off the excess string or yarn and then to put
on bracelet.
- White - represents that we are sheep, and that God
is our shepherd
- Green - represents all of nature, which provides us
with God's peace
- Black - represents the hard times, but God's peace is
with us even during difficult times
- Yellow - represents God's peaceful presence, which
gives us joy
