BIBLE PASSAGE: God Gives Victory Over Jericho (Joshua 6:1-27)

When the time came for the Israelites to conquer the city of Jericho, God gave them strange instructions. They weren't to attack the high-walled city with tools or weapons. Instead, they were to walk around the city once a day for six days while the priests blew trumpets. Then, on the seventh day, the Israelites were to walk around the city seven times while the priests blew trumpets and then give a loud shout. The Israelites trusted God, so they obeyed the strange instructions. Because they relied on God's power instead of their own power, the walls of Jericho fell!

Bible Point: God's power works for good.

Key Verse: "Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you." (1 Peter 5:7)

Daily Challenges

Choose a way to help you remember that God's power works for good in your life.

- Every time you worry about something, write it down on a piece of paper. Then throw it away, asking God to take that worry away.
- Whenever you use a TV, microwave, or radio, thank God for all the ways he uses his power for good.
- Read the headlines of a news website that your parents trust. Pray for the situations that you read about. Ask God to use his power for good in each of those situations.



Jericho's Wall

Use graham crackers and frosting to make a "wall of Jericho." The frosting can act as mortar for the graham cracker "bricks." The wall doesn't have to be as tall and thick as the wall God knocked down! After you've built the wall, pretend to blow trumpets, give a loud shout, and knock down that wall. Then gobble it up!

God's Power

The next time you're caught in a (lightning-free) rainstorm at home, go out on the front porch or even to a nearby window to watch the sights and sounds. Explain that storms are nothing to be afraid of when you're inside. Help your child observe the power of nature in the wind and rain. Talk about the power of the storm, and discuss how storms can cause good things to happen—plants being watered, old tree branches being removed for new ones to grow, and leaves being removed from the yard, for example. Then remind your child that God is more powerful than the storm, and his power can help us feel safe.

- What were you thinking as you watched the power of the storm?
- What's so great about how the Israelites watched the wall fall down in Jericho?
- Why do you know God's power take care of you?
